The walk around the Koh Andet Island is offered on the basis of **two guests** or more (subject to guide availability).



You should bring: your camera

How long: 1-2 hours or as long as you are enjoying yourselves

Includes: your guide

Limitations: the tour can be performed all-year-around except in very heavy rain

Formerly a refuge from the Khmer Rouge, Koh Andet (Floating Island) is across the river and in front of your tent. Today it is a peaceful home to a dozen farming families.
